OUR POSITIVE MENTAL HEALTH INFORMATION PROJECT

One of our current projects is to convert our Bramhall client waiting room into an attractive eye-catching information centre for everyone involved with Beacon to use. It will include a library of books on creating and sustaining positive mental health care for our clients and counsellors to use and take away. We plan to launch this centre at the start of 2009 and have dedicated volunteers already planning and resourcing this project. The information will be there to encourage clients to help themselves to better mental health and well-being. Counsellors will also be able to use the information in conjunction with their counselling, and the appointments administrators can send the information out to clients still waiting for counselling. All this will help Beacon to become a more responsive service for our clients, and also respond more quickly to need. Examples of some of this information will be: eating for good mental health, coping with depression, reducing levels of anxiety, exercising for good mental health, local walking groups and many, many more.

The team (but particularly James) have been working hard on tendering for a contract with the GP's of Marple and Werneth to offer a counselling service next year to a long existing waiting list that they presently have. James met the deadline last Friday with what they consider to be their most thorough and professional tender to date. Results will be announced in 2 weeks, so lets keep our fingers crossed!

A new admin initiative:

We have introduced an improved client monitoring and evaluation spreadsheet which reveals that during the last quarter 92% of our clients were White/British and 8% were Black/Other. This roughly matches the ethnic mix for Stockport as a whole, which is 96% White. This shows that we are reaching the people we should and that people from ethnic minorities can access our service as easily as others. This is important information that founders particularly see as a positive attribute in a charitable organisation.

We are offering all our qualified counsellors a training course during January to March on Cognitive Behavioural Therapy.
This will be funded jointly by The John Lewis Partnership together with the Manchester Guardian Society Trust.

One or two counsellors have recently left us for pastures new so we have to replace them. Our interview process is vigorous so only the most superior applicants are successful. We offered places to six new counsellors.

Following the Open Forum, several changes in our finances were agreed that will be implemented between now and the end of the year. Whilst these will help to reduce the annual shortfall we face, events fundraising is an increasingly important part of keeping Beacon afloat. This means that we have to raise more funds through events than ever before. 2008 has seen an

excellent start to this with the Charity Dinner and from the Premiership Drive, but 2009 will see our fundraising target from events increase by another £1,000 in order to maintain our adult

service. At the moment, we have about 12 months to do something about the situation so we have plenty of time.

So far several ideas have been put forward:

- A Complementary Therapies Taster Day (in planning for early 2009)
- A "Beacon Feel Good Foods" recipe collection
- Encouraging everyone to join EveryClick to raise internet funding for us (we have admin volunteer Julia promoting this for us)
- A sponsored walk and celebration in Lyme Park for Beacon's 25th Anniversary
